Step by Step Guide to Homeless Enumeration



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Introduction

As part of the Province's efforts to end chronic homelessness by 2025 and the long-term goal to end homelessness, the Ontario Ministry of Housing (MHO; the ministry) has introduced a provincial requirement to conduct local enumeration of people experiencing homelessness. The Province requires all Service Managers to conduct enumeration of those experiencing homelessness in their communities. Local homeless enumeration, which is the measurement of the number of people experiencing homelessness over a specific period of time, will help Service Managers and the ministry better understand the scale and nature of homelessness across the province, as well as inform current and future policy and program design.

Why is it Necessary to Estimate Homelessness?

There are multiple benefits to conducting a homelessness estimate. The estimate can be used by communities to:

1. Track progress in reducing homelessness.
2. Direct public attention towards the homelessness issue.
3. Improve homelessness and housing agencies planning programs.
4. Inform local, provincial and federal, policies.
5. Establish standards for performance measurement.
6. Provide data for the community and the service providers.
7. Help secure funding to improve resources to help people that are homeless.
8. Provide demographic information to identify where community resources are most needed.
9. Help target interventions for particular subpopulations experiencing higher levels of homelessness.
10. Apply for specific support based on the makeup of the local homeless population; for example, additional support for veterans, seniors or youth.

The Registry Week Approach

Rural communities experience unique circumstances that prevent them from using the standard Point in Time (PIT) approach to estimate homelessness. The Registry Week method is a coordinated, multi-day count of people experiencing homelessness on the streets, in shelters, food banks, outreach agencies, income support service, and in other community-identified spaces frequented by people experiencing homelessness.

It also involves a coordinated outreach and assessment process to collect information and create a list of people experiencing homelessness, by name, starting with the most vulnerable, in order to prioritize access to permanent housing and supports.

Volunteers administer a survey – pre-screening and triage tool – that collects personal data and ranks participants on a vulnerability index. The information collected can be used to inform decisions about

how best to refer individuals experiencing homelessness to housing resources, as well as to prioritize individuals for accessing rapid re-housing and other supports on a “by-name list”.

Capturing Hidden Homelessness

Many people experiencing homelessness stay with relatives, friends, acquaintances, neighbours or strangers because they do not have a permanent home. They are considered “hidden” because they are not visible in the community as experiencing homelessness and may not use services available to people experiencing homelessness even though they do not have a place to call home.

As people experiencing hidden homelessness are difficult to identify, current enumeration methods will likely not reflect the full scope of homelessness in a community or Service Manager area. However, partnering with community agencies will be conducive to reaching people who are experiencing hidden homelessness. Partnering with police, clergy, veterans affairs, hospitals and community mental health will help us reach homeless individuals who may not actively use service agencies. Partnering with the Algonquins of Pikwakanagon will ensure that we reach our indigenous community.

In order to most accurately estimate the number of homeless people within a rural community, it is essential for all service agencies to be on board and on the same page. Partner Agencies should all understand the importance of hosting a Registry Week and how the data collected will benefit them and the community as a whole. This will help ensure that all service agencies successfully contribute to the Registry Week.

The Program Coordinator, Renfrew County Housing Corporation will contact community agencies, deliver surveys, and gather the collected data for the Registry Week. This information will then be collected by the Program Coordinator to be uploaded to the Ministry.

Backpacks and surveys will be delivered. Back pack contents include:

- \$10 cash
- Toothbrush/toothpaste
- Wipes
- Water bottle
- Protein Bar
- Gum

The Definition of Homelessness

“According to the Canadian Observatory on Homelessness, homelessness describes the situation of an individual or family without stable, permanent, appropriate housing, or the immediate prospect, means and ability of acquiring it. It is the result of systemic or societal barriers, a lack of affordable and appropriate housing, the individual/household’s financial, mental, cognitive, behavioral or physical challenges, and racism and discrimination.”

- Unsheltered: Living on the street or in places not intended for human habitation
- Emergency Sheltered: People who are staying in overnight shelters due to homelessness or family violence. This also includes those who receive hotel/motel vouchers where no emergency shelters exist or in overflow situations.
- Provisionally Accommodated: People with accommodation that is temporary or that lacks security for tenure.
- At Risk of Homelessness: People who are not yet homeless but their current economic situation is precarious.

Training is key to the success of the Registry Week. It is important to train partner agency on the process and guidelines for conducting the Registry Week. Preparing partner agency for the Registry Week will include ensuring they understand the definition of homelessness, and how to properly complete the survey.

Training will focus on:

- Focus of the count
- The approach and methodology
- The survey questions
- The process and timeline for returning the completed surveys back to the County of Renfrew

Sufficient marketing and communications are important to successful homelessness Registry Week, as they can create awareness and encourage people to access services during the Registry Week period. The Program Coordinator will work closely with the County Media Relations person to establish a marketing plan.

Media will include:

- Web
- Newspaper
- Radio

March 19-22 survey packages will be delivered which include:

Data entry and analysis is a critical part of the Registry Week. Completed surveys will be returned to the Program Coordinator who will upload the data to the Ministry as per Ministry reporting instructions. The Service Manager will share their local enumeration results publicly by March 31, 2019.

What is County of Renfrew Registry Week?

As part of the Province's efforts to end chronic homelessness by 2025 and the long-term goal to end homelessness, the Ontario Ministry of Housing (MHO; the ministry) has introduced a provincial requirement to conduct local enumeration of people experiencing homelessness. The Province requires all Service Managers to conduct enumeration of those experiencing homelessness in their communities. Local homeless enumeration, which is the measurement of the number of people experiencing homelessness over a specific period of time, will help The County of Renfrew, and the ministry to better understand the scale and nature of homelessness not only in the County of Renfrew but across the province, as well as inform current and future policy and program design.

In 2013, through the implementation of its 10-Year Housing and Homelessness Plan, Renfrew County declared ending homelessness as one of its priorities. The campaign will support many of the objectives which we committed to in our 10-year housing and homelessness plan including lobbying for increased supportive and affordable housing, advocating for a National Housing Strategy, gathering data to understand housing needs and service gaps, coordination with other services, collection of housing and homelessness statistics for public education, and development of lobbying materials to use with provincial and federal governments to seek support to end homelessness.

Why is the Registry Week so important?

The information gathered from the surveys will be helpful in understanding Renfrew County's homelessness situation so that we can plan and prioritize resources and educate the broader community. The data will also be used to inform provincial and federal partners of Renfrew County's homelessness and housing needs. The information will be used to support continuous improvement of practices and will help highlight the importance of, and need for, additional affordable housing.

What is the connection between registry week and getting people housed?

The survey questions directly relate to people's housing stability. The survey will highlight key areas where there are high levels of risk to people in our community experiencing homelessness. We will use this information to assess whether we are providing the right types of services and supports.

It also provides us with an opportunity to speak about the systemic barriers with other key sectors in a specific way. For example, if we learn that there are a significant number of people

frequently accessing the ER we can share this aggregated information with our local health sector and discuss targeted intervention strategies. In order to create housing stability for people we need to ensure that risk factors are being addressed effectively.

Do's

- ✓ Introduce yourself and explain what you are doing (use the introductory script)
- ✓ Be sincere, caring, and thank people for their time
- ✓ Remain calm and de-escalate any tense situations
- ✓ Maintain appropriate distance
- ✓ Honor requests to not participate and to skip questions
- ✓ Provide people with Back packs
- ✓ Provide information on programs and services (If you feel comfortable) – but please remember the purpose of administering the survey is not to solve problem, counsel, or case manage

Don't's

- ✗ Mandate participation in the survey
- ✗ Be judgemental
- ✗ Promise housing or services – or market your agency's services
- ✗ Give money or offer rides
- ✗ Deviate from the survey
- ✗ Share confidential information with survey participants
