



Warden's Family Day Challenge

HIGHLIGHTS

County Council met on July 22nd and adopted by-laws to move ahead on some major projects. On the Operational side Council gave the go ahead to proceed with the execution of the contract for the rehabilitation of County Road 19 (Mud Lake Road). The project also includes the resurfacing of the McDonell's, and Johnston bridges. The project is in part funded by through the Ontario Community Infrastructure Fund.

With regards to the OPP base project in Renfrew, Council passed three resolutions. First a resolution that will create an itemized price agreement between the partners in the building of the OPP Base. Such an agreement will clearly define how costs are divided between the County and the OPP, and Infrastructure Ontario. The County of Renfrew through its legal counsel has prepared an agreement that will ensure the interests of all parties are protected. After reviewing the submitted tenders, County Council passed a second resolution directing staff to re-tender the contract, with the goal to award the new tender at the October session of County Council.

The third resolution passed by council was regarding that the County of Renfrew is required to enter into a Site Plan Control Agreement with the Town of Renfrew. Essentially, the resolution acknowledges the County and the Town will work to meet all necessary requirements with regards to the building site from a construction and planning perspective.

Finally, Council approved the disposal and sale of four decommissioned paramedic service vehicles. Two were authorized for sale to Priority Patient Transfer Services, one to the City of Pembroke and one to the Sunshine Coach.

County of Renfrew Warden Peter Emon is hosting the 'Warden's Family Day Dunk Tank Challenge Fundraiser'; an event to raise funds for the Renfrew County United Way and highlight the services offered by the County of Renfrew to residents. The event will be held at 9 International Drive at the County Administration Building on August 15th.



Featuring family activities, entertainment and a community BBQ, the event will offer visitors the opportunity to 'Dunk The Councillors.' Warden Emon said "The United Way is much like our own in the way that we both serve the entire county as a whole, it funds existing programs, and also new community based

initiatives. We have a responsibility to promote Renfrew County and service the whole community, and this fundraiser allows us to do that."
