

2019 County of Renfrew Flood Statistics

(PRESS)

- 347 Military Personnel in Renfrew County comprised of 3 units from Garrison Petawawa supported by resources of LAV 3's, assault boats and Chinook and Griffin helicopters for aerial reconnaissance. Roles include sandbagging, wellness checks and presence patrols.
- 2 manned Coast Guard crafts accompanied with a Community Paramedic for checks on isolated residences, assisting in extrication and patrolling hard to reach areas.
- Coordination with OPP for public safety concerns and wellness checks of residents.
- 32 partnered Paramedic and RCDHU staff visits to residents.
- 22 Drone flights in 8 municipalities
- 66 Community Paramedic upstuffs for 792 hours of flood response
- 820 wellness checks on residents
- Over 15,000 km travelled by Paramedics

Impact on County of Renfrew

- Approximately 100 residents displaced currently peaking at 150 during the worst flooding.
- 580 permanent and 398 seasonal residences impacted (~ 1000)
- Km of shoreline affected = 1600 km total. Ottawa River - 478 km, Petawawa – 81 km, Madawaska – 678 km, Bonnechere 364 km
- Hwy 17 closed from Apr 22nd to Apr 27th
- 715,000 sandbags distributed and 641,000 in reserves = 1.35 million in play
- 22 large capacity pumps distributed, 24 in reserve.

Laurentian Valley

- 97 permanent and 39 seasonal residences with 38 residents displaced

Horton

- 46 permanent and 57 seasonal residences with 16 residents displaced

WhiteWater

- 150 permanent and 150 seasonal residences with 55 residents displaced

Other

- 15 Freshet teleconferences MNRF and CEMCs
- 15 PEOC teleconferences
- EOC stood up since April 28th
